TREE PROTECTION PLAN NOTES

- 1. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure protected property is not located near or within an adjacent road or an adjacent boundary line with their neighbours. Should such trees be required to be removed, the applicant may be held responsible through civil action. The applicant would also be required to replace such trees to the satisfaction of Urban Forestry.
- 2. Tree protection barriers shall be installed to standards as detailed in this document and to the satisfaction of Urban Forestry.
- 3. Tree protection barriers must be installed using plywood clad boarding (minimum 10mm or 1/2" thick) or equivalent approved by Urban Forestry.
- 4. Where required, signs as specified in Section 4. Tree Protection Signage must be attached to all sides of the barrier.
- 5. The applicant must ensure that any tree located within the protection zone is not damaged or removed.
- 6. Once all tree protection measures have been installed, Urban Forestry staff must be contacted to arrange for an inspection of the site and approval of the tree protection measures.
- 7. Tree protection barriers must remain in place and in good condition during demolition, construction and/or other activities. The protection barriers must be removed or replaced as required by Urban Forestry.
- 8. No excavation activities including grade changes, surface treatment or excavation of any kind are permitted within the area defined on the tree protection plan (TPZ). No root cutting is permitted. No storage of materials or equipment is permitted within the TPZ. The trees must be protected and remain undisturbed at all times.
- 9. All additional tree protection or preservation requirements, above and beyond the installation of tree protection barriers, must be the responsibility of the applicant and must be approved by Urban Forestry.
- 10. The applicant must ensure that any tree located within the protection zone is not damaged or removed.
- 11. If the minimum tree protection zone (TPZ) must be reduced to install a structure, the tree protection barriers must be maintained at a lesser distance and the exposed portion of TPZ must be protected using a horizontal root protection method approved by Urban Forestry.
- 12. Any root or branches protruding on the plan within the TPZ must be removed by Urban Forestry staff. The applicant must ensure that any tree located within the protection zone is not damaged or removed.
- 13. Urban Forestry will be provided with a copy of the tree protection plan (TPZ) and a copy of the tree protection measures. The applicant must ensure that any tree located within the protection zone is not damaged or removed.

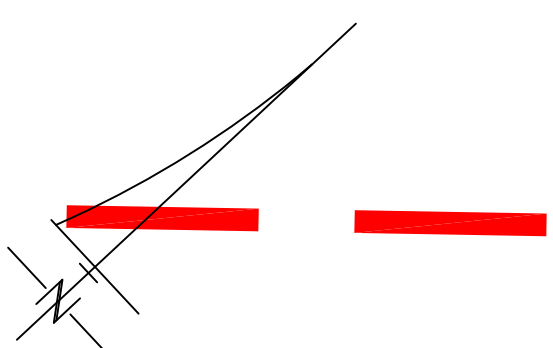
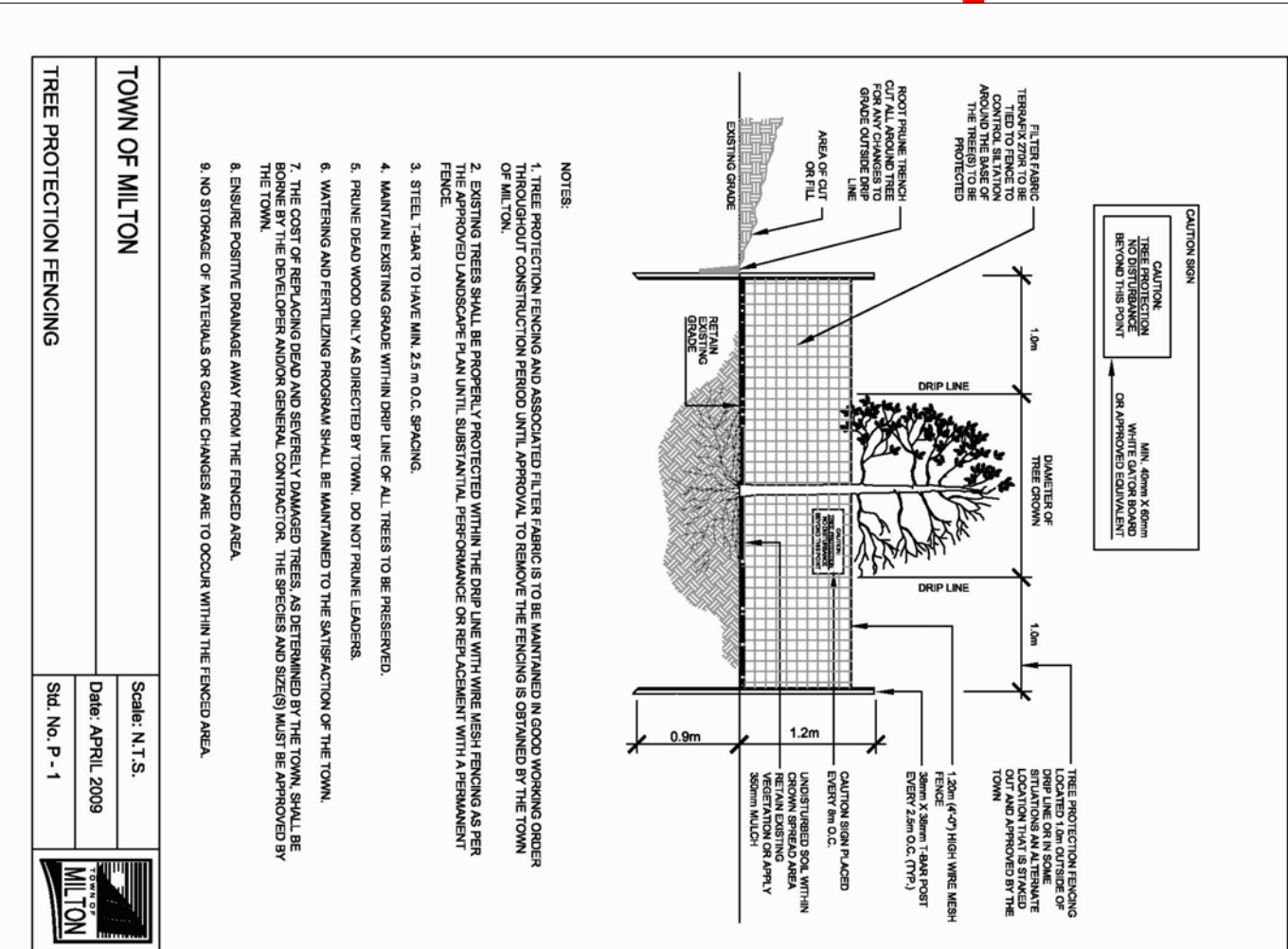
