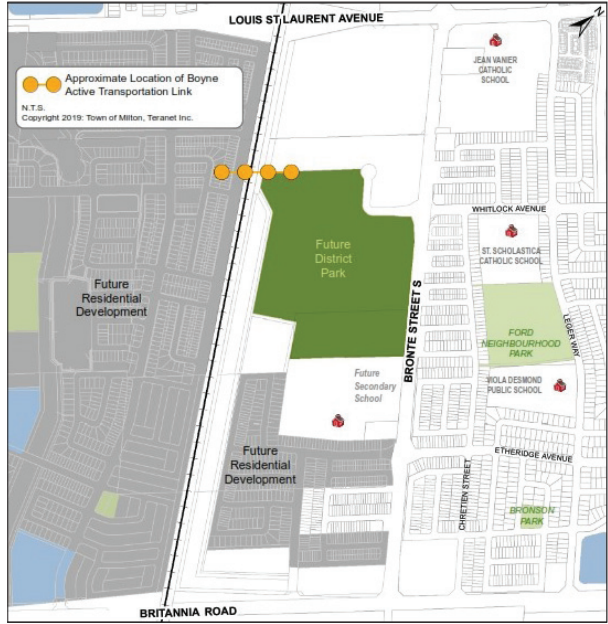

Notice of Study Commencement and Public Engagement for Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

What is this study about?

The Town of Milton has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study to consider the construction of a new pedestrian and cyclist connection across the Canadian National Railway between Louis St. Laurent Avenue and Britannia Road (see attached map). With lots of homes, schools and parks on both sides of the rail corridor, the Town has identified the need to provide better and safer ways to access these places of interest in the community.



How is the study being carried out?

The study is being conducted in accordance with the approved requirements for a Schedule 'C' Environmental Assessment as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association (MEA) Municipal Class EA document, which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

You are invited to participate.

During this study, the Town will host an online engagement event and Public Information Centre (PIC) to seek feedback. Our online engagement event is currently scheduled for September 2019. The PIC is currently scheduled for November 2019, with exact dates to be determined. The purpose of the online engagement will be to solicit feedback and input on the project. The focus of the PIC event will be to provide an overview of the study process and discuss the potential features of the crossing. Details regarding both events will be posted on the Town's website, social media channels, and mailed or emailed to those on our mailing list.
